- children start learning the moment they are born
- nearly 90% of brain development occurs by the age of five (Missouri Office of Childhood)
- school-age children and youth spend 80% of their waking hours outside of school (Youth.gov)

- Daycare for children ages four weeks-preschool
- Youth Program provides out-of-school time care for children ages 5-12

Big Brothers Big Sisters St. Joseph

- Serves kids starting at age 7 who want/need a positive mentor and help form life-changing friendships

Catholic Charities of Kansas City-St. Joseph

- Mom's Empowerment program provides case management and assistance for pregnant families through the child's first year
- Adoption Services supporting birth and adoptive families

Children's Mercy St. Joseph

- Provides pediatric and specialty health care to area children and youth

Family Guidance Center for Behavioral Healthcare

- Individualized services based on the need of the child and family to assist with emotional disturbances, mental illness and substance use disorders
- Behavioral Health Urgent Care Clinic serving children ages 5+

InterServ

- Early Care and Education at Mitchell Woods
- Youth Program that supports youth in the areas of academics, relationships and health through healthy relationships with adults, providing a nutritious meal, tutoring and homework assistance, weightlifting and being part of a positive community

Northwest Missouri Community Services

- Provides a phone service directing families needing information/assistance to appropriate health and human services
- Provides resources to meet basic and immediate needs including diapers and shoes for school-age children

Pony Express Council, BSA

- Traditional scouting that helps prepare youth for a successful future by developing academic skills, self-confidence, ethics, leadership and citizenship skills.
- Camping program held at Camp Geiger

St. Joseph Safety & Health Council

- Safety Town provides a simulated town where young children learn safety skills
- Safety Acres young children how to stay safe while living and playing in a rural setting
- Car seat program encourages parents to get their child's car seat checked and provides new seats at no charge for those who qualify
- Driver's Education and Permit Academy to teach teens how to drive safely

The Salvation Army

- Youth Program that provides a safe environment to develop life skills, positive social and communication habits and the opportunity to learn new things
- Emergency shelter for families with minor children providing a safe place to stay, case management and access to resources
- School supplies for children

Samaritan Counseling Center, Inc.

- Outpatient mental health services and autism testing

UCP

- Physical, occupational and speech therapy for children
- Integrated Preschool for children ages 2 – 5 including children with and without special needs

- Summer Work Experience provides area high school students with disabilities entering their senior year an opportunity to experience a first job.
- All Students Achieve is a collaborative program held at Mosaic Life Care designed to improve employment outcomes for high school seniors through classroom activities and an unpaid internship for students

- United Way Reading Adventure helps school-age kids improve and maintain their reading skills by sending volunteers to read with students on a weekly basis.
- Speakers' Bureau connects business and industry professionals with students to share about their education and career paths. They also assist classes with project-based learning opportunities.
- Take A Book Tuesday is a partnership with Second Harvest's No Hunger Summer program and several local school-age childcare providers to help kids build their home libraries

- Works with parents, grandparents, primary caregivers, child care providers and business leaders to help prepare children to be successful learners when they begin kindergarten

- Youth Development programs that provide a safe, fun and educational environment before and after school and during summer break
- Youth Sports

YWCA St. Joseph

- Discovery Child Care Center for children ages 6 weeks-6 years.
- GRIT Center provides a safe space for teens ages 12-19 with a drop-in resource center, mentoring and outreach services
- Healthy Teen Parents Healthy Babies serves pregnant and parenting teens ages 12-19.
