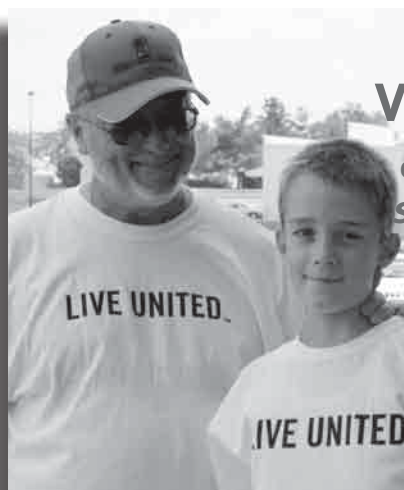

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

The cover photo for this report shows our community LIVING UNITED through United Way. As we give, advocate and volunteer together through United Way of Greater St. Joseph, we focus on education, health, and financial stability to impact real people around us through the caring power of community. As the 2012 United Way Board Chair, I thank you for the good you've done and continue to do.

I've served through United Way for reasons that are probably similar to why you support United Way. I care about our community and the people in it. When an infant is born with developmental challenges, I want to know that a network of services is ready to help parents help their child. When an elderly man is growing frail and unable to leave home alone safely, I want to know that he can remain secure and healthy for as long as he's able to take care of himself in his own home. When a family watches their house burn to the ground in the middle of the night, I want to know that someone can help them with basic needs while they figure out how to move on. Together, through United Way, we are ensuring good in ways that none of us could make happen alone. See pages 3-4 for more information about United Way impact.

As supporters of United Way of Greater St. Joseph have worked together toward our mission, some important projects have been carried out in 2012. Here are some highlights:

GIVING. Thousands of donors pledged \$3,330,439 to the 2012 United Way Campaign under the leadership of Campaign Chair Bob Wollenman. Together, we met the Campaign goal to ensure that United Way of Greater St. Joseph can continue to fund lasting change in Northwest Missouri and Northeast Kansas.

ADVOCATING. Nearly 150 people from the community answered the call to provide input to United Way in June and July during United Way's Community Conversations so that United Way could review its funding model and set a path toward how donor dollars will impact area lives in the future.

VOLUNTEERING. Over 850 people registered to receive information about area volunteer opportunities from United Way. Volunteerism is an important way for the community to help our area non-profits carry out important work for all of us. United Way Volunteer Center connects the community through volunteerism. ANNIVERSARY: The 30th graduating class of United Way Leadership St. Joseph celebrated as they joined the ranks of over 700 others who have completed leadership development training through the program.

UNITED WAY'S FOCUS

BUILDING BLOCKS OF A GOOD LIFE

United Way of Greater St. Joseph focuses on education, health, and financial stability because these are the foundation blocks upon which quality life is built.

Education is essential to obtaining and keeping a job with a livable wage. Good health keeps children on track in school and allows adults to be productive. Financial resources allow families to secure today's necessities and to save for the future. All three (education, health, and financial stability) are crucial to building a solid base for strengthening the community.

UNITED WAY IMPACTS THE COMMUNITY, NOT ONLY BY PROVIDING SERVICES, BUT ALSO BY SUPPORTING PARTNER AGENCIES AND BY WORKING TO HELP THE COMMUNITY COME TOGETHER IN RESPONSE TO PARTICULAR EDUCATION, HEALTH, AND FINANCIAL STABILITY NEEDS. CAMPAIGN DOLLARS ARE ALLOCATED TO 7 UNITED WAY INITIATIVES AND PROGRAMS, 19 PARTNER AGENCIES, AND MANY OTHER LOCAL PROGRAMS. UNITED WAY SUPPORTS SERVICES THAT AIM TO IMPROVE LIVES.



EDUCATION

Kelsie and Kara, 8 and 9-years-old, have experienced neglect that is difficult for most people who hear their story to imagine. Their Grandma, upon gaining custody of the the girls, discovered a system of United Way Partner Agencies to support their education that had also been neglected. Affordable, after-school care allows Grandma to keep her job, knowing that someone trustworthy is helping the girls with homework. Grandma thinks that adult mentors and Scouting might also be good educational

supports for the girls when they're ready. Thousands of area children and adults benefit from educational programs through the United Way community of agencies.

- ▶ 2,461 at-risk children and youth participated in programs to increase their chances of succeeding in life.
- ▶ 1,289 people were trained in swimming or lifeguarding skills.
- ▶ 449 adults were trained about issues related to occupational safety in their workplaces.

United Way of Greater St. Joseph works to help people of all ages reach their potential through a variety of educational pursuits that will, in turn, strengthen our community. Quality early learning, youth education in and out of the classroom, and a variety of other instruction for life-long learning are just a few ways United Way supports education.

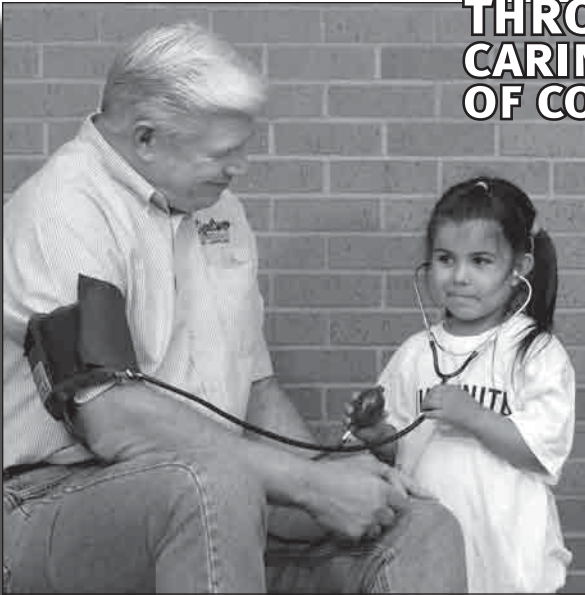

IMPROVING LIVES THROUGH THE CARING POWER OF COMMUNITY



HEALTH

Jim has lived with depression for years. Stress felt increasingly unbearable as he grieved his wife's death and struggled to pay his bills in a timely manner on a fixed income after retirement. Through United Way Partner Agencies, he was linked to helpful counseling funded by United Way dollars and was also connected with other Partner Agencies. He now enjoys company and nutritious meals at a congregate senior meal site. He's feeling more energy and hope. Thousands of area people are improving health habits through United Way supported programs.

- ▶ 591 senior adults received nutritious meals to help maintain health.
- ▶ \$15,166,355 in uncompensated medical care was provided to Buchanan County children.
- ▶ 1,444 people worked through alcohol and drug addiction recovery.

In the Greater St. Joseph Area, your contributions help people of all ages improve their physical and mental well-being. Health is promoted through fitness and wellness activities, nutrition and in-home services, counseling, and other important programs. Good health is crucial for everyone.

FINANCIAL STABILITY

Denise began waitressing at age 16 and worked in food services into her forties when she needed aggressive and immediate, medical treatment that left her unable to work. Thanks to several United Way Partner Agencies, she is receiving benefits for which she is eligible. She received legal assistance to help with illegal interest rates she was being charged by a loan company. She's saving money on needed medication with a prescription discount card and plans to see about free tax preparation and the Earned Income Tax Credit

next year. Times are still lean, but Denise no longer lives with the constant, daily fear of losing the small home she worked hard to own. Thousands of area people report increased financial stability thanks to the work of United Way and Partner Agencies.

- ▶ 129 people in danger of foreclosure developed plans that resulted in successfully maintaining home ownership.
- ▶ 672 people received budget counseling to help them through financial crisis.
- ▶ 1,418 men, women, and children received emergency shelter.

Stable household finances are important for daily living, which is why United Way of Greater St. Joseph also focuses on financial stability. United Way supports efforts for families and individuals in crisis. Such efforts include food, disaster relief, information and referral, and shelter services related to homelessness or domestic violence. United Way is also working to prevent financial situations from becoming problems in the first place.

UNITED WAY INITIATIVES AND PROGRAMS

SUCCESS BY 6®

Preparing children to be successful learners when they begin kindergarten since 1999.

United Way Success By 6 fosters and participates in community-wide partnerships to prepare young children for future success. The initiative aims to strengthen the system that nurtures the community's youngest children by working with parents, childcare providers, early education teachers, and local businesses who can all help children develop.

During the year, over 120 incoming kindergarteners graduated from United Way Kindergarten Jumpstart and United Way KinderClub, two kindergarten readiness programs.

The initiative continues to focus on supporting quality improvement efforts of area childcare providers. Faced with dramatic State funding cuts, United Way Success By 6 convened community leaders to determine how to effectively address new gaps. A community-wide childcare provider training plan was created that leverages resources and brings additional funders to the table. In response to the continuing need for management and leadership training of childcare directors, United Way Success By 6 enhanced and expanded directors' networking meetings and assumed responsibility for the directors' symposium.

LEADERSHIP ST. JOSEPH

Building the skills of individuals to be effective leaders in the community since 1982.

United Way Leadership St. Joseph is an annual, year-long leadership development program for adults living or working in the St. Joseph area. The program helps create a network of trained individuals willing to engage in leadership and community service with enhanced knowledge of our community's opportunities, realities, and challenges.

In 2012, twenty-four community members completed the 30th year of the program, joining over 700 past graduates.

During the year, participants learned and practiced project development related to essential leadership skills. The class was divided into four groups and challenged to learn the process of developing a project that would meet a community need. The challenge resulted in the following projects: Tiny Tot Town comeback, YWCA Economic Empowerment Program, Diaper Depot, and a Big Brothers Big Sisters Recruitment Video.

The 2012 Distinguished Leader Award was presented to Class of 2005 Alumnus, Kylee Strough. She was honored in recognition of her exceptional community leadership.

PROFIT IN EDUCATION® Improving the education level of the potential and current workforce since 1989.

United Way Profit In Education works to continue increasing the high school graduation rate and collaborating with and supporting education efforts across the community.

In 2012, the United Way BEST (Business and Education Succeed Together) program served over 50 students, grades 7-10. Business partners worked with students, helping them learn about local businesses, different jobs available, and required training and education.

Also, United Way Reading Adventure, a summer reading program, was held at five sites. On average, 70 volunteers read with 200 children each week. The goal of United Way Reading Adventure is to help elementary-age students maintain their reading skills over the summer and to help build home libraries with donated books.

VOLUNTEER CENTER

Connecting the community through volunteerism since 2009.

The United Way Volunteer Center is a central resource for volunteer needs across the Greater St. Joseph region. Individuals, groups, and corporations seeking volunteer opportunities can find a variety of options with varying commitments at many different non-profit organizations.

In 2012, with the assistance of Chick-fil-A, over 850 people registered to stay up-to-date about area volunteer opportunities through the United Way Volunteer Center. Volunteers working with United Way STUFF THE BUS! School Supplies Drive collected over 21,200 packages of school supply items for students who needed them. A Holiday Volunteer Guide was created and offered to connect those wanting to volunteer during the season. Fifty-six new volunteer opportunities were posted, and seven additional non-profits were registered with United Way Volunteer Center in 2012.

UNMET NEEDS COMMITTEE

Collaborating to connect people to resources to solve immediate needs with lasting impact since 1993.

The United Way Unmet Needs Committee meets monthly to identify alternative resources and solutions for cases brought before them. In 2012, representatives from non-profits, churches, utility companies, government agencies, and community members collaborated, helping clients with needs for which there are few or no resources. Common needs were prescriptions, dental care, and rental assistance. Through the work of the United Way Unmet Needs Committee, area people were connected to resources to help them gain and maintain stability.



FINANCIAL STABILITY

Providing opportunities for individuals and families to become financially self-sufficient since 2009.

The United Way Financial Stability Initiative focuses on three things: 1) providing financial education opportunities; 2) increasing the use of free tax preparation services and promoting the Earned Income Tax Credit; and 3) advocating for local, state and federal policy change to help prevent poverty and to help people move out of poverty.

In 2012, forty-four students in two St. Joseph School District elementary schools participated in United Way Millionaires' Club, an after-school financial education program conducted in partnership with US Bank. In addition, components of the curriculum were integrated into a summer school session focused on financial education and entrepreneurship. The goal of United Way Millionaires' Club is to teach young children the importance of making wise financial decisions and to equip them with the tools to do so.

United Way Financial Stability Initiative promoted free tax preparation services offered by United Way Partner Agency, InterServ. During the 2012 tax season, a total of 2,352 individuals received tax assistance. Volunteer preparers filed 468 Earned Income Tax Credit returns for a total of \$4,055,546. Over 1.72 million dollars were received locally through tax refunds. Free tax preparation services help people keep and save their own money.

HELP FUND

Supporting local health programs through grants since 2002.

United Way HELP (Health Efforts for Local People) Fund recipients are awarded grants for up to \$10,000 for local, health-related programs or projects.

2012 recipients were: St. Joseph Safety and Health Council's Bike Safety and Helmets; Catholic Charities' Permanent Housing program; Bartlett Center's Social Advocate; Heartland Regional Medical Center's Patee Youth Dental Clinic; Second Harvest's Backpack Buddies program; Social Welfare Board's Dental Hygiene Clinic; and Social Welfare Board's Diabetes Management Initiative.
